



OPERATING PROCEDURES

INTRODUCTION

These Procedures define how Sailing and Power Boating is managed at Dart Sailability to provide a safe environment for all sailors and volunteers. Other aspects of the Management of Dart Sailability are defined in the Handbook.

NOTE:

These Procedures replace the Procedures in the Handbook and Operating Procedures V21.1 dated April 2022 (HoPs). Other aspects of the Management of Dart Sailability remain as defined in HoPs pending further work to edit out the operating procedures to form the new Handbook.

A full set of Procedures is available via the website and a hard copy is available in the Club House.

Relevant Procedures are held in Duty Officer Folders in the Blue Container

Copies of some procedures are held in Boat Safety Boxes eg rigging guidance and Incident Management

Volunteers must read all Procedures that apply to the activities that they undertake.

All Volunteers should read:

- Operating Procedure 16 – Radio Operation
- Operating Procedure 19 – Incident Management

- Operating Procedures 20, 21, and 22 on how to report Defects, Injuries and other Incidents
- Operating Procedures 7 – 12 if they will be assisting in the preparation of boats

All Volunteers will also find it useful to be aware of the responsibilities of Duty Officers and Skippers

Volunteers fulfilling the roles of Boat Skipper must read:

- The relevant Boat Skipper's Responsibilities, Competencies and Guidance
- Operating Procedure 32 – Sailing Areas and Hazards
- Operating Procedure 33- Operating Limits
- Operating Procedure 17 – Man Overboard Recovery

Volunteers fulfilling roles as OOD, Pontoon Master, Shore Party must read their own and be aware of the others' Operating Procedures and Guidance

- Operating Procedure 2 – OOD Responsibilities and Guidance
- Operating Procedure 3 – Pontoon Master Responsibilities and Guidance
- Operating Procedure 4 – Shore Party Leader Responsibilities and Guidance

OOD must also read Operating Procedure 32 – Sailing Areas and Hazards and Operating Procedure 33 – Operating Limits

Volunteers will be asked to confirm that they have read relevant instructions each year.
